Anthropological Conceptions of Religion: Reflections on ...

Geertz begins by observing that the anthropological study of religion is stagnant, and suggests that resort to the concept of culture would revive it

Culture is then defined as 'an historically transmitted pattern of meanings embodied in symbols, a system of inherited conceptions expressed in symbolic

The anthropological study of religion has, of course, no place for overt or covert statements about the truth of religion, or of one religion rather than another Durkheim stated quite correctly that there is no such thing as a study of religion-that all such study can only be one of re-ligions, or of a specific religion
